# WELCOME TO MEMBERSHIP IN THE BACH CHOIR OF PITTSBURGH

The following information will help you know and understand what is expected of you, as well as what the choir will bring to you, as a member of Bach Choir of Pittsburgh.

# **COMMITMENT**

The success of this organization is dependent on your faithfulness and diligence. Upon acceptance to the Choir you are making a commitment to fully participate as a choir member through attendance at <u>all rehearsals and concerts</u> for the season. The Choir's subscription season runs from September through May. If you must miss a concert, prior arrangements are to be made <u>in writing</u> with the Artistic Director.

Attending rehearsals is the primary commitment you make to the Choir. You are expected to work on your music outside of rehearsal. Online study aids will be provided for you to use to practice.

Please Note: In addition to the regular Tuesday night rehearsals there is a rehearsal scheduled for <u>Saturday, October 6<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 am – 12:00 pm</u> to prepare for the November 2018 concert. Rehearsal Location: Unity Presbyterian Church, 1146 Greentree Rd Pittsburgh, PA 15220

# **AUDITIONS**

All members are re-auditioned each year. All singers are expected to continually improve their musicianship, vocal skills, and knowledge. # **DUES POLICY**

- Member dues for 2018-19 are \$185.00 for Individual Members or \$155.00 for Students & Seniors (65+ older). Core and alternate core singers are required to pay dues.
- If payment is made on or by September 4th, 2018, a \$10.00 discount is offered making the dues \$175.00 or \$145.00. Payment plans of three monthly installments are available.
- Payment may be made by personal check or credit card. Credit cards incur a 4% processing fee.
- Members joining after 12/31/18 pay prorated dues for the remainder of the season (\$100 Individual Member; \$85 Students/Seniors).

#### COMMUNICATIONS

- **Group email:** We rely heavily on email to distribute information to the membership. Please make sure you provide a valid email address. The office will send you a link to join the Google Group email distribution list.
- Rehearsal Notes: After each rehearsal the choir president will send a "Rehearsal Notes" email with
  information on what music was rehearsed in addition to any choir specific announcements made at that
  rehearsal.
- Bach Choir private Facebook group: In its second year, we have a private Facebook group for Bach
  Choir members called Singers of the Bach Choir. It is a place to communicate with each other on such
  things as carpooling, other concerts being offered in the area, etc. Shelly Parver is the group

# **SCORE PREPARATION**

The Artistic Director often emails information or "Love Notes" regarding the pieces/sections of music he plans to rehearse so that you can prepare. Familiarity with the music assigned is crucial. Bring a pencil to each rehearsal to mark your music. If you miss a rehearsal, it is your responsibility to attend the review session, check the "Rehearsal Notes" email and ask a core member in your section for specific markings. Online tools and/or rehearsal CDs are often available and can be used to assist in your preparation.

#### RENTED MUSIC

- Due to copyright and publishing laws, the choir will occasionally rent music for members.
- Rented or borrowed music may <u>only</u> be marked with pencil. No markings in pen or highlighter are
  permitted even if the score provided has them. Please notify the Music Librarian if your score is heavily
  marked, unreadable, or in poor condition.
- If a member does not return a rented score he/she is **financially responsible** for any charges incurred by the choir.

# **ABSENCE POLICY** All rehearsals are required!

All decisions related to concert attendance are at the discretion of the artistic director. If you see that you have conflicts with rehearsals (such as work travel) that would prevent you from singing in a concert based on the criteria below, please send choir president <u>Bill Blackburn</u> an email describing your circumstance and the dates you will be missing. He will work with Thomas on communicating his decisions about concert participation.

# ITS Policy for 2018-19 season

The purpose of the Independent Testing Session (ITS) is to ensure that choir members missing rehearsals are, indeed, well-prepared to perform in a concert set. To that end provide a weekly Review Session based on the previous week's material rehearsed as well as an ITS if needed. Here is the policy:

- Choir members are excused from <u>2 rehearsals</u> per concert set **ONLY** if they do the following:
  - The week after an absence the choir member will attend a Review session, led by Jon Erik, from 6:45-7:15 pm to review material from the previous week. Choir members MUST attend the Review session the week following an absence.
  - o Choir members absent for <u>more than 2 rehearsals</u>, are required to have an ITS with Thomas, even if weekly Review Sessions have been attended.
  - Choir members absent from <u>1 (one) rehearsal that DO NOT attend a weekly Review</u>
     <u>Session</u> are required to complete an ITS with Thomas.
- Members unable to attend both dress rehearsals will not be allowed to sing in the concert.
- Arriving late and/or leaving early equates to ½ an absence.
- The Saturday retreat is scheduled for October 6<sup>th</sup> and will count as ½ a rehearsal.
- The Artistic Director can excuse a member from performing if the member is not prepared.
- In the event of an unexpected absence, please call or email your <u>Section Manager</u>. Please do <u>NOT</u> contact the Artistic Director or the Office Staff.

All rehearsals are held from **7:30 PM – 10:00 PM** in **Levy Hall at Congregation Rodef Shalom** (4905 Fifth Avenue, Pittsburgh, PA 15213) across from WQED in Shadyside. Enter the building from the parking lot side.

# Important information about our rehearsal space

- The ONLY "consumable" you can bring into Levy Hall is water. A resealable bottle is best.
- Please park only in the spaces along the back wall of the parking lot furthest away from the entrance. Spaces in the lot need to be saved for patrons attending other events. If parking along the wall is full, park on Morewood or Devonshire.

- Solid black one-piece dress or two-piece top/skirt combination
- Floor length
- Modest neckline
- ¾ sleeves or longer
- No pants, flowy or otherwise
- No sequins, shiny trim or distracting ornamentals
- Black stockings (no nude stockings, please)
- Black shoes
- Jewelry should complement and not distract from your black outfit.

# **Choir Dues Payment-Refund Policy**

Choir member dues comprise a significant percentage of the total choir income and are necessary for funding every aspect of the choir's operating expenses. As such, all choir members are expected to do their part in supporting the financial needs of the choir. Ideally, each choir member should pay their dues during the first month of the season in one or two payments outlined below.

The Operating Committee understands that an individual may experience a temporary financial hardship and require financial assistance. Two options are available to such individuals as outlined below. Preferably, the member and treasurer can establish a payment plan that suits the needs of both the member and the choir. Alternatively, the member can apply for a partial or full grant. Grants are underwritten solely by donations from other choir members and, therefore, are limited in number and amount.

2018-2019 season dues are \$185 (non-student) and \$155 (student & senior). Dues are required of core members. A \$10 reduction is provided for dues remitted by the first rehearsal. Furthermore, should non-core members desire to remit the annual dues in two payments, at least half of the dues (i.e., \$92.50 and \$77.50) may be remitted prior to the second rehearsal and the remaining dues may be remitted on or by the fourth rehearsal. Dues may be partially offset through the acquisition of advertisements.

<u>Payment plans</u> - Payment plans must be arranged in writing between the choir member and the treasurer. For the current season of three concerts, the required remission plan will be three \$60 (\$50 for students) payments over the first three months of the season, i.e., by the end of November. Until the first payment of \$60 (\$50 for students) is received, music for the first concert must be returned at the end of each rehearsal (up to a maximum of three rehearsals). Following the third rehearsal, no music will be provided for and the choir member will not be permitted to perform that concert. Should the remaining dues not be paid within the three-month period, no additional music will be provided to the choir member.

#### Grants

- To be considered for a grant, the prospective recipient must complete and provide a <u>written</u> application to the treasurer for consideration. Grants should be requested no later than the second rehearsal.
- Should the grant be provided, recipients will sign a form acknowledging the grant and stating that, in lieu of paying dues, recipients will be required to volunteer their time when asked or needed to work off the underwriting privilege. Arrangements for volunteering may be made through the treasurer or any other member of the Operating Committee. Examples of volunteering are helping in the choir office and setting up and breaking down before and after each concert.
- A choir member that is underwritten will be required to pay a minimum of \$25 per concert to help cover the cost of music. At the discretion of the treasurer, this may be waived for up to the first two rehearsals; however, the member must return the music after each rehearsal. Following the second rehearsal, no music will be provided for and the choir member will not be permitted to perform that concert.
- In an extreme case, a choir member may be underwritten for a maximum of two seasons. However, because of the limited number of grants each season, first-time requests will be given priority over repeat requests.

Failure to meet the outlined stipulations will result in an individual being unable to continue participation with the choir until such time as the necessary payment has been made.
