WELCOME TO MEMBERSHIP IN THE BACH CHOIR OF PITTSBURGH

REHEARSALS

The success of this organization is dependent on your faithfulness and diligence. Upon acceptance to the Choir you are making a commitment to fully participate as a choir member through participation in all rehearsals and performances for the season. The Choir's season runs from September through April.

Please Note: In addition to the regular Tuesday night rehearsals there is a rehearsal scheduled for <u>Saturday</u>, <u>October 16th from 9:00 am – 12:00 pm</u> to prepare for the November 2021 concert. IF the Artistic Director feels that the choir has made sufficient progress at regular Tuesday rehearsals, <u>this rehearsal may be cancelled</u>. Rehearsal Location: Unity Presbyterian Church, 1146 Greentree Road, Pittsburgh, PA 15220.

<u>COVID PROTOCOL:</u> All singers must be fully vaccinated prior to the first rehearsal and will have submitted proof of vaccination via a photo of their vaccination certificate emailed to the Choir President, Polly McQueen (<u>pollysmcqueen@gmail.com</u>). In addition, all singers will wear singers' masks at rehearsals and will sit apart from each other. Attending rehearsals is the primary commitment you make to the Choir. You should expect to work on your music outside of rehearsal. On-line study aids will be provided to use to practice. <u>If you must miss a rehearsal, please notify your section manager in advance</u>. Contact information for all four section leaders is in the section above about the Operations Committee ("OpsCom").

ABSENCE POLICY: All rehearsals are required! However, this being said, please do NOT ATTEND rehearsal if you are experiencing any of the symptoms on the list for Covid.

All decisions related to concert attendance are at the discretion of the Artistic Director. If you have conflicts with rehearsals (such as work travel) that would prevent you from singing in a concert based on the criteria below, please send Choir President Polly McQueen (pollysmcqueen@gmail.com) an email describing your circumstances and the dates you will be missing. She will work with Thomas on communicating his decisions about concert participation.

Independent Testing Session (ITS) Policy for 2021-22 Season

The purpose of the Independent Testing Session (ITS) is to ensure that choir members missing rehearsals are well-prepared to perform in the concerts. The ITS is generally held immediately before the Tuesday rehearsal in concert week.

- Choir members are excused from <u>2 rehearsals</u> per concert set **ONLY** if they do the following:
 - The week after an absence the choir member will attend a Review session, led by Jon Erik, on Tuesdays from 6:45-7:15 pm to review material from the previous week. Choir members MUST attend the Review session the week following an absence.
 - Choir members absent for <u>more than 2 rehearsals</u>, are required to have an ITS with Thomas, even if weekly Review Sessions have been attended.
 - Choir members absent from 1 (one) rehearsal but who DO NOT attend a weekly Review Session are required to complete an ITS with Thomas.
- Members unable to attend <u>both</u> dress rehearsals will not be permitted to sing in the concert.
- Arriving late and/or leaving early equates to ½ an absence.
- The Saturday rehearsal scheduled for October 16th will count as half a rehearsal.
- The Artistic Director can excuse a member from performing if the member is not prepared.
- In the event of an unexpected absence, please call or email your <u>Section Manager</u>. Please do <u>NOT</u> contact the Artistic Director or the Managing Director.

ABSOLUTELY NO PERFUME, COLOGNE, OR OTHER SCENTS AT REHEARSALS OR PERFORMANCES. Some singers have scent sensitivity, so please be sensitive to them and follow this rule.

REHEARSAL LOCATIONS (See "Season Schedule" on p. 5 for dates, etc.)

All September rehearsals will be held in the Sanctuary at Eastminster Church at 250 N. Highland Avenue 15206. Enter the church through the glass doors on Station Street. Street parking is free after 6:00 pm and on Sundays. Metered public parking (enforced Monday through Saturday until 10:00 pm) is available in the lot at Sheridan and Kirkwood (enter from Sheridan). Parking in the Home Depot lot is at your own risk.

Rehearsals for the rest of the season will be held in Levy Hall at Rodef Shalom at 4905 Fifth Avenue 15213. Park ALONG THE FAR WALL of the Temple's parking lot (enter from Morewood or Devonshire). There will be some Tuesdays when the Congregation holds large meetings, so you will need to park on the street. Please bring ONLY WATER into Levy Hall.

AUDITIONS

Normally all members re-audition each year, but for the 2021-2022 season, only new members are required to audition. Current core members (i.e. those selected for the 2019-2020 season) are not required to re-audition, but they may do so if they wish. (Auditions WILL be held for new core positions for 2021-2022, so membership in the core may change.) Contact Carter Wellons at auditions@bachchoirpittsburgh.org if you have any questions.

DUES AND REGISTRATION

All members must register online at www.bachchoirpittsburgh.org. Dues may be paid by check or credit card. A 4% service charge is automatically applied to all payments made online. You can mail your check to the Bach Choir at PO Box 5253, Pittsburgh, PA 15206.

Dues for the 2021-2022 season are:

- Regular member dues = \$195 (\$185 if paid by September 28, 2021)
- Senior (65+) & Student dues = \$165 (\$155 if paid by September 28, 2021)
- Need assistance with dues? Refer to the <u>Choir Dues Payment-Grant Policy</u> below. *All special payment arrangements will be kept strictly confidential.*

We have often been asked what we spend choir dues on. The annual expense for artists (artistic leadership and supporting artists), music, rehearsal and concert venues and concert production is about \$800 per choir member. If we were to break it down by member, it would look something like this:

Artists \$500
Music \$55
Rehearsal and concert venues \$180
Concert Production \$65

Dues cover just under 20% of the choir's budget, and the rest comes from a combination of ticket sales, fundraising events, individual donations, sponsorships and grants. It's a real team effort!

COMMUNICATIONS

- Choir Member Hub: The website has a member's area with helpful links, updated information and a
 calendar. We rely heavily on email to distribute information to the membership. Please make sure to
 maintain a valid email address in your membership profile. You can access login and registration links at
 https://www.bachchoirpittsburgh.org/singers/. Once registered, the choir administration will manually grant
 you access to this area.
- Rehearsal Notes: After each rehearsal the Choir President will send a "Rehearsal Notes" email with information on what music was rehearsed in addition to any choir-specific announcements.
- Bach Choir private Facebook group: There is a private Facebook group for Bach Choir members called Singers of the Bach Choir. It is a place to communicate with each other on such things as carpooling, other concerts being offered in the area, etc. Shelly Parver is the group administrator. - Bach Choir Google Drive Intranet: Here you will find valuable information including rehearsal aids, electronic copies of concert posters/flyers and a choir member photo directory. SCORE PREPARATION

So that you can prepare for rehearsal, the Artistic Director often emails information regarding the pieces/sections of music he plans to work on. Familiarity with the music assigned is crucial. Bring a pencil to each rehearsal to mark your music. If you miss a rehearsal, it is your responsibility to attend the Review Session (see below), check the "Rehearsal Notes" email and ask a core member in your section for specific markings. On-line tools and/or rehearsal CDs are often available and can be used to assist in your preparation.

FUNDRAISING AND MARKETING

We are a small non-profit organization supported by individual contributions, foundation grants and corporations. Our budget is lean with BCP staff continually looking for ways to cut costs without sacrificing quality. The Board is a working board and is committed to seeking increased funding opportunities within the personal and professional networks of both Board members and Bach Choir singers. Choir Dues Payment-Grant Policy

Choir member dues comprise a significant percentage of the total choir income and are necessary for funding various aspects of the choir's operating expenses. Ideally, each choir member should pay their dues during the first month of the season.

The Operations Committee understands that an individual may experience temporary financial hardship and may require financial assistance. Here are two options for situations like this:

Payment Plans

If a singer finds him/herself unable to pay their dues in September, a payment plan can be arranged via email between the choir member and the Choir President, Polly McQueen (pollysmcqueen@gmail.com). For the current season of three concerts, the required remission plan will be three payments over the first three months of the season, i.e., by the end of November.

Grants (funded by contributions from other choir members)

If a singer finds him/herself completely unable to afford their annual dues, the singer should email Polly McQueen, Choir President (pollysmcqueen@gmail.com), outlining in specific terms the reason for the request. Grants should be requested no later than the second rehearsal and will cover one year's dues in their entirety.

CONCERT INFORMATION

Call time for concerts is typically 1.5 hours prior to concert start. Final call times are set during concert week. Saturday evening concerts begin at 8:00 pm and Sunday afternoon concerts at 4:00 pm. No water on stage, please. BLACK FOLDERS ARE REQUIRED FOR ALL PERFORMANCES.

Concert Dress

<u>MEN</u>: black tuxedo with black bowtie; white formal or dress shirt, black socks and shoes. Sometimes in less formal concert situations, Thomas will ask the men to wear a black T-shirt with their tuxedo.

WOMEN: Solid black one-piece dress or top/skirt combination, floor-length, modest neckline, ¾ sleeves or longer. NO PANTS or sequins, shiny trim, etc. Black stockings and black shoes. Jewelry should complement concert dress.
