Under the leadership of Conductor and Artistic Director Thomas W. Douglas, the choir continues to evolve from a narrowly-focused ensemble to a larger, more inclusive choir that performs major choral works by composers from the Renaissance through the present.

Program Notes

Queen was a British rock band whose fusion of heavy metal, glam rock, and camp theatrics made it one of the most popular groups of the 1970s. Queen crafted an elaborate blend of layered guitar work by guitar virtuoso Brian May and overdubbed vocal harmonies enlivened by the flamboyant performance of front man and principal songwriter Freddie Mercury. The members were Freddie Mercury (original name Farrokh Bulsara; b.1946, d. 1991), Brian May (b. 1947), John Deacon (b. 1951), and Roger Taylor (b. 1949).

Members of two bands composed of university art-school students combined to form Queen in London in 1971. Aided by producer Roy Thomas Baker, Queen shot up the international charts with its third album, *Sheer Heart Attack* (1974).

A Night at the Opera (1975), which includes "Lazing on a Sunday Afternoon" and "You're My Best Friend" and is one of pop music's most expensive productions, sold even better. Defiantly avoiding the use of synthesizers, the band constructed a sound that was part English music hall and part Led Zeppelin, epitomized by the mock-operatic "Bohemian Rhapsody," Britain's top single for nine weeks. Spectacular success followed in 1977 with "We Are the Champions" and "We Will Rock You"—which became ubiquitous anthems at sporting events in Britain and the United States. *The Game* (1980), featuring "Crazy Little Thing Called Love" and "Another One Bites the Dust," was Queen's first number one album in the United States.

Queen has been a global presence in popular culture for more than half a century. Estimates of their record sales range from 250 million to 300 million, ranking them among the world's best-selling music artists. Their popularity waned for a period in the 1980s, but a stellar performance at the charity concert Live Aid in 1985 reversed their fortune commercially. In 1990, Queen received the Brit Award for Outstanding Contribution to British Music. The band gave its final performance in 1995. Queen was inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in 2001. The band's formation and rise to stardom are the topics of the blockbuster film *Bohemian Rhapsody* (1981).

Brian May and Roger Taylor currently perform with Queen + Adam Lambert.

Farrokh Bulsara, aka Freddie Mercury, was born in Stone Town, Zanzibar (now part of Tanzania) to Parsi parents who had emigrated from India to Zanzibar, where his father worked as a clerk for the British government. As a child, Bulsara was sent to a boarding school in India. Artistically inclined from an early age, he formed a band there in which he played the piano. When Zanzibar unified with mainland Tanganyika to become the modern nation of Tanzania in 1964, Bulsara moved with his family to England. He studied graphic art and design at Ealing Technical College. Following graduation, he joined a series of bands and had some odd jobs. In April 1970, he teamed up with Brian May and drummer Roger Taylor to become lead singer of their band Smile, which was later joined by bassist John Deacon. Mercury changed the name of the band to Queen in 1971. In this time frame, he began a long term relationship with Mary Austin. Mercury and Austin remained lifelong friends, but his romantic relationship with her ended when he revealed his bisexuality. On 23 November 1991, Mercury publicly revealed that he had AIDS and the next day died of bronchopneumonia, a complication of AIDS.

Sir Brian Harold May, lead guitarist for Queen, is also an astrophysicist having earned a PhD degree in astrophysics in 2007. He was a "science team collaborator" with NASA's *New Horizons* Pluto mission. Most of May's virtuoso electric guitar work live and in the studio is done on the Red Special, which he built with his father, an electronics engineer, when he was sixteen years old. May was appointed a Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire in 2005 for services to the music industry and for charity work and recently received the title of Knight Bachelor on March 14, 2023.



THOMAS W. DOUGLAS Artistic Director, is a compelling and passionate conductor having performed more than 250 opera, oratorio, orchestral and musical theater productions. As the Artistic Director of the Bach Choir of Pittsburgh he regularly receives accolades for innovative, creative and dramatically provocative productions. He was also the music director of the Newton Symphony in Kansas. Career highlights include conducting Webber's

Phantom of the Opera in Basel, Switzerland, Gershwin's Porgy and Bess, the Pittsburgh premiere of the classic silent films *The Passion of Joan of Arc*, with live orchestra and chorus, the U.S. premiere of David Chesky's *The Agnostic*, the rousing *Carmina Burana Africana*, Mozart's *Die Zauberflöte* and *Don Giovanni* and a production of *Ain't Misbehavin'* in Malaysia.

Douglas works regularly as Musical Director at Music Theater Wichita where he has done many productions including *Smokey Joe's Café, The Little Mermaid, Ragtime, Hairspray, The Full Monty, Miss Saigon, Beauty and the Beast* and *Les Misérables* among many others. He has also conducted the Anchorage Opera, San Diego Symphony, Seattle Symphony, Des Moines Symphony, Pittsburgh Symphony, at the City Theater, Pittsburgh Festival Opera, Canton Symphony, Wichita Symphony, Dallas Symphony and the River City Brass Band. In addition, Douglas has conducted classical guitarist and Latin Grammy winner Berta Rojas, Tony winner Kelli O'Hara, and Leslie Odom Jr., Tony winner for his role in *Hamilton*.

Thomas has enjoyed the stage roles of Amonasro in Elton John's Aida, Caiaphas in Jesus Christ Superstar and Balthazar in Amahl and the Night Visitors. He has been a vocal soloist with the River City Brass, Pittsburgh Opera, Pittsburgh Symphony, Canton Symphony, the Children's Festival Chorus and sings frequently with jazz legend Joe Negri in his Mass of Hope. Douglas is the Director of Opera Studies and also Choral Activities at Carnegie Mellon University. This is his 19th season with the Bach Choir of Pittsburgh.

JON ERIK SCHREIBER Associate Conductor, is a teacher, singer and conductor with a background in vocal pedagogy, choral and solo song literature, and has experience in musical theater, folk and popular styles. With over two decades of experience directing high school choirs, church and community choirs, Schreiber is grateful for the rich and varied experiences leading and collaborating with all sorts of musicians young and old, challenged

and gifted, small groups and large. In addition to serving the Bach Choir of Pittsburgh as Associate Conductor, Schreiber teaches music and directs the Chorus at Pittsburgh Allderdice High School. He is the founding Artistic Director and Conductor of the Indiana Community Choir at Indiana University of Pennsylvania (IUP), and also maintains an independent studio of voice students. Above all, he is thankful for the opportunity to serve his family as a father and husband.



JAMES BURNS Accompanist, has been a frequent performer with groups such as the Opera Theater of Pittsburgh, Pittsburgh Ballet Theater and the Mendelssohn Choir. As a pianist for the Civic Light Opera he has performed in over 100 musical theater productions. He has had the pleasure of bringing music to young students through his work with educational outreach programs for Gateway to Music and the Pittsburgh Opera. Burns holds piano

performance degrees from Oberlin Conservatory of Music. and the Julliard School and a Masters degree in Sacred Music from Duquesne University. He is the organist at Westminster Presbyterian Church and Temple Emanuel.

THE BAND



CHRIS THOMAS *Guitar*, is a guitarist, teacher and luthier in the Pittsburgh area. He received a BA in music performance (jazz guitar) from Duquesne University in 1994. Chris has performed with local and national artists such as the the duo Leah and Chris, The Honeyriders, Modern Times and the Rick Purcell Band, Joe Negri, Charlie Haden, Randy Purcell, Stanley Turrentine, Joe Beck, The Shirelles, Jim Nabors and performed as an opening act for Barry Manillo, Chubby Checker, The Indigo Girls,

Soul Asylum and Rod Stewart. Show performances have included *West Side Story, Little Shop Of Horrors, Jesus Christ Superstar, Addams Family, The Wiz* and *Children of Eden* to name a few. He received a Post Baccalaureate Certification in music education from Duquesne University in 2003 and a Masters of Arts Teaching from California University of Pennsylvania in 2010. Chris is currently employed as a music teacher in the Elizabeth Forward School District. He resides in Forward Township with his wife and daughters where he also spends lots of time in his shop as a luthier. The guitar Chris is playing is his creation and a tribute to one of his heroes, Sir Brian May.



BRIAN STAHURSKI *Bass*, received his formal education at Duquesne University, earning a Bachelor's degree in Jazz Performance in 1989 while studying with Jeffrey Mangone and a Master's degree in Performance in 1992 while studying with Anthony Bianco. Since then he has performed with the Pittsburgh Ballet Orchestra, Major Broadway touring productions, the Wheeling Symphony, WQED's *Live from Studio A* on PBS television and various Jazz, Blues, Salsa, Pop and Rock artists

around Pittsburgh. Brian toured with jazz trumpet legend Maynard Ferguson and his Big Bop Nouveau band around the world from 1999 - 2001 playing jazz festivals, clubs and universities in the United States, Europe and Asia. He also performed on two notable recordings during that time: vocalist Michael Feinstein on "Big City Rhythms" with Maynard Ferguson, and with renowned vocalist Diane Schuur on *Swingin for Schuur*, also featuring Mr. Ferguson. Both albums are on the Concord Jazz label. He is currently Professor of Bass Studies at Slippery Rock University, California University of Pennsylvania, Duquesne University and bass guitar instructor at the Winchester Thurston School.

SCOTT BONI *Saxophone,* is a saxophonist from Washington, PA. His relationship to the city of Pittsburgh was formed through a childhood involvement with the arts. As a member of the Children's Festival Chorus, he performed at many venues around the city. "I believe my experience with CFC laid the foundation for my path into music as an adult. When we rehearsed and performed it was very focused and intense. We had fun, but we were expected to act like young professionals. It was

a wonderful experience and I have no doubt that all of the singing I did helps me every time I play the saxophone." Studying at Boston's Berklee College of Music, he was exposed to creative ideas by classmates and teachers from around the world. "That was truly life-changing for me. It helped me grow both personally and musically. I'm thankful to be performing here in Pittsburgh. I'm busy working with both old and new friends. That's one of the great gifts found through the arts – the relationships you make. Pittsburgh has such an incredible jazz history and it's both humbling and inspiring to be working in the current scene." Scott is employed as a realtor and enjoys exploring Pittsburgh's history through books, films and antiques.



BOBBY KUNKEL *Drums*, One of Pittsburgh's most reliable and versatile drummers, Bobby writes, records, and performs with North Of Mason-Dixon (NOMaD), and is a long-standing member of the worship team at New Community Church in Wexford. His performance and recording credits include In The Mood, The Nick Dialoiso Orchestra, Anderson/ Hewlett, Bon Journey, Yinz & Roses, Trenton Antill, and Domenic Fusca, among many others. A graduate of Duguesne University, Bobby also is an

educator/teacher and is currently authoring a method book for beginner and intermediate drummers. "I am so very excited and honored to this opportunity with the Pittsburgh Bach Choir to perform the music of Queen and Freddie Mercury. To quote Freddie himself, 'On with the show!!" - BK

SCOTT ANDERSON *Keyboard*, is a two time Emmy award-winning composer, music director, producer and one of the Pittsburgh region's most sought-after keyboard players. Scott received an Emmy award in 2006 for his work composing the score for the award-winning documentary *From Pittsburgh to Poland: Lessons from The Holocaust.* In 2007 he won both an Emmy and a Telly award for his work as music director and co-producer of *Live From Studio A: American Standards.* Scott was also

nominated for Emmy awards in 2003 and 2004 for his work as Music Director of WQED's *Live From Studio A* television show and again in 2010 for music contributed to the film *In Service*, a joint production of Pittsburgh Filmmakers and Bricolage. He was the organist for the Pittsburgh Penguins and a member of the Penguin's house band, The Blue Line Band, for three years. Scott's musical diversity is what propelled him to preferred status as a keyboard player for the region's top performers, including Joe Negri, Benny Benack, Pete Hewlett, Eric DeFade, Lisa Bleil, Billy Price, Kenny Blake, and on and on. He can go from Jazz to Big Band to straight-ahead Rock & Roll without missing a beat.
